Proceedings of a Military Commission
convened at Camp Release opposite the
mouth of Shippewa River by virtue of
the following order

Order No 55

Head Quarters Camp Release
Sept 28, 1862

A Military Commission composed
of Colonel W^m Brooks of the 6th Regiment
Lieut Colonel Marshall of the 5th Reg Captains
Grant & Parley of the 6th Reg & Lieut Blair
of the 3rd Reg will convene at some
convenient point in camp this morning
at 11 o'clock ~~to~~ try summarily the
Mullatto & Indians or mixed bloods
or who may be brought before them by
direction of the Col Commanding &
pass judgment upon them if found
guilty of murder or other outrages on
the whites during the present state of
hostilities of the Indians. The proceedings
of the Commission to be returned to
these Head Quarters immediately
after their conclusion for the considera-
-tion of the Col Commanding. The Commission
will be governed in their proceedings
by Military Law & usage.

 mission was cleared, and proceeded with their find-
 ing and sentence

 deliberation on the foregoing find the prisoner, the
 Daniel Chas - Raydon or Chas Ray - et al, a Slave
 An African as follows
